AUDITION

The Helena Symphony Orchestra encourages talented and dedicated musicians to audition. Musicians are judged on musicianship, preparation, tone quality, and proficiency on their instrument. The Audition Committee consists of the Music Director, any assistant conductor, and principal members of the section(s) or instrument family (i.e. winds), and at times, other members from that section. Prior to the audition, the candidate must complete the Audition Information Form as well as review the Rehearsal & Performance Schedule.

The Audition consists of the following:

- * Prepared unaccompanied solo; 2 minutes in length to demonstrate instrument proficiency, tone quality, technique, and virtuosity (need not be memorized)
- * Several prepared excerpts that are assigned to demonstrate musician's preparation ability (Excerpts are available online via www.orchestraexcerpts.com)

VIOLIN

Solo: 2 minutes of a solo of your choosing OR 2 minutes from a movement from Mozart's Violin Concertos Nos. 3, 4, or 5

Choose one of the following:

Brahms Symphony No. 4 Movement II, m. 30-39 and m. 88-101

Mozart Symphony No. 39 Movement II, Beginning to double bar at m. 28,

and m. 96-125
