Singers can sing alone...

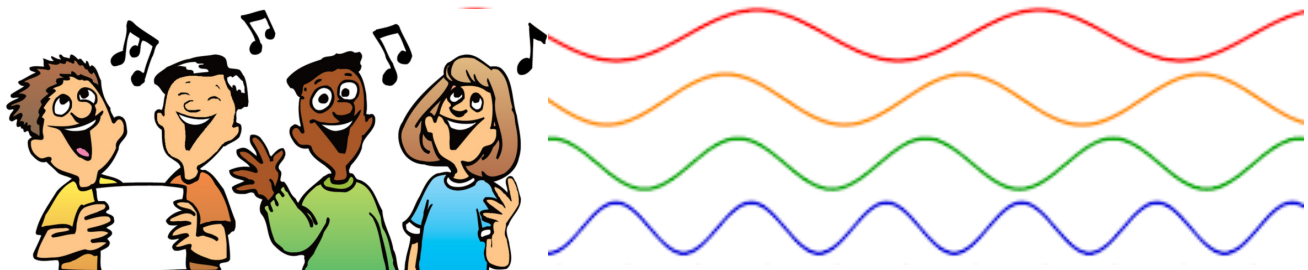
so there is one line of sound...like this.....

Gary Barlow

Gary Barlow was born in 1971. He is a popular songwriter, record producer, actor, and singer from the United Kingdom. **Eliot Kennedy** was born in 1969. He is an English songwriter and record producer. Kennedy and Barlow cowrote the music and lyrics for *Finding Neverland*, a Broadway show about Peter Pan.

Randall Thompson *Frostiana: The Road Not Taken*



Randall Thompson (1899 - 1984) was an American composer particularly noted for his choral works. He was the son of an English teacher; he had a long career as an educator. Although his writing for voice spanned his entire life, Thompson also produced three symphonies, two string quartets, and other instrumental pieces. Today's show features *The Road Not Taken*, from *Frostiana*, which Thompson wrote in 1959 on the texts of poet, Robert Frost.

Frank Ticheli *Earth Song*

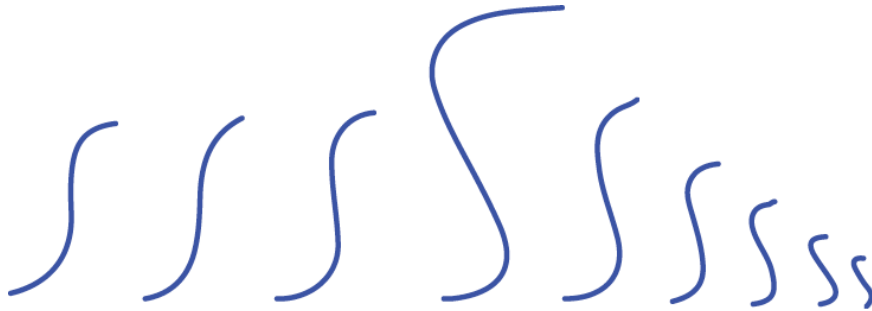


Frank Ticheli was born in 1958. He is an American composer of orchestral, choral, chamber, and concert band works. He lives in Los Angeles, CA, where he is a Professor of Composition at the University of Southern California. Today's show features his choral composition, *Earth Song*. 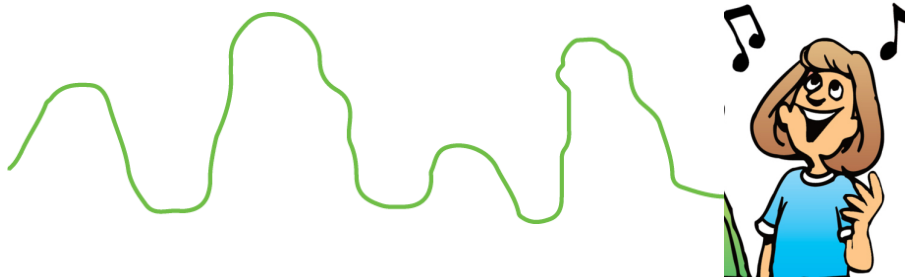
Now let's experiment with **YOUR** voice!

Now try making your voice sound like these green **bumps**.



Now, make our voice sound like these red, jagged **mountains**.
